QUALIFICATIONS, LIMITATIONS, REQUIREMENTS, AND CONDITIONS

- 1 Applicant is a graduating senior and must attend Central Lafourche High School, Covenant Christian Academy, E.D. White Catholic High School, Ellender Memorial High School, Grand Isle High School, H.L. Bourgeois High School, Houma Christian School, South Lafourche High School, South Terrebonne High School, Terrebonne High School, Thibodaux High School, or Vandebilt Catholic High School.
- 2 Applicant has a grade point average of 2.5 or better and has taken the ACT or SAT Assessment.
- 3 Applicant may choose to attend any state college or university of their choice and choose any curriculum leading towards a bachelor's degree.
- 4 The applications will be reviewed and approved by the Board of Directors of the Fourchon Oilman's Association.
- 5 The scholarship will be paid through a check from Fourchon Oilman's Association. One-eighth will be paid at the beginning of each of eight consecutive semesters. A student who graduates from college in less than four years may receive the remaining balance of the scholarship upon graduation.
- 6 At the end of each semester, the recipient will be required to show evidence that he or she has maintained a 2.5 average (per semester, not cumulative) as a full time student (12 or more hours) and must be enrolled for the next semester as a full time student, or forfeit the remainder of the scholarship. This must be presented to Dr. Joseph A. Orgeron for review and authorization of a payment for the subsequent semester. Previous semester grades and full-time status of upcoming semester can be initially provided via email to FourchonOilman@GMail.com, and hard-copy will need to be supplied only if subsequently requested.
- 7 One parent of applicant MUST be employed by a member or sponsor of the Fourchon Oilman's Association in order to be eligible for this scholarship. If employment with the relative is terminated for any reason the recipient is eligible to continue receiving the award if the remaining requirements are met.
- 8 Applicant should attach a typed one page narrative explaining the following:

"How has the oil industry influenced your life while living in South Louisiana?"
- 9 Applications must be post marked by April 7 to be considered for scholarship award.
